

NINTH EDITION OF FOG DESIGN+ART BOASTS STRONG SALES AND ATTENDANCE

San Francisco, CA (January 24, 2023) – The ninth edition of FOG Design+Art closed on Sunday, January 22, 2023, following a robust presentation at Fort Mason Center for Arts and Culture. The fair featured 45 exhibitors from Chicago, London, Los Angeles, Mexico City, Milan, Monte Carlo, New York, and San Francisco, among others, including first-time exhibitors Casemore Kirkeby (San Francisco), gió Marconi (Milan), Marc Selwyn Fine Art (Los Angeles), Night Gallery (Los Angeles), Nilufar Gallery (Milan), and Nonaka-Hill (Los Angeles).

The fair opened on Wednesday, January 18 with a Preview Gala benefitting the educational programs and exhibitions of the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art (SFMOMA). More than 2,000 guests from the art, design, business, and tech communities, attended the sold-out Preview Gala. Notable attendees included:

Throughout the weekend, tickets were sold out. The annual FOG Talks program included many popular conversations, including an exploration of how material research and environmental sustainability can uplift craft with designers Yves Béhar, Fernando Laposse and Ivy Ross; a conversation between artist Machine Dazzle and Tony Bravo (*SF Chronicle*); a look at the future of generative AI with artist Trevor Paglen, curator Larry Ossei-Mensah (ART NOIR), and professor, researcher, and author Kate Crawford; a deep dive into the art and language of hip hop with artist Troy Lamarr Chew II and Sickamore, an artist and Senior Vice President of A&R and Creative Director at Interscope Records, moderated by Dr. Andreana Clay, PhD (SFSU); a conversation with Bay Area artists Ana Teresa Fernández and Sadie Barnette moderated by writer and curator Dr. Natasha Boas;

and a discussion of how arts institutions and organizations can collaborate on creative solutions to climate change with gallerist Todd Hosfelt; curator Claudia Schmuckli (Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco); and art historian, curator, and co-founder and managing director of Art + Climate Action Jodi Roberts.
