

FOG DESIGN+ART ANNOUNCES EXPANSION OF FAIR WITH NEW PLATFORM FOG FOCUS AND EXHIBITOR LIST FOR FAIR'S TENTH EDITION

2024 Fair Celebrates Cultural Vibrancy and Vitality of the Region with Theme "A Love Letter to San Francisco"

San Francisco, CA (October 18, 2023) – FOG Design+Art is excited to share the fair's exhibitor list for 2024 and to announce that in celebration of its tenth anniversary the fair will launch FOG FOCUS, an invitational designed to showcase art by young and underrepresented artists. Housed in Fort Mason Center's Pier 2 building, the former home of the storied San Francisco Arts Institute (SFAI), FOG FOCUS celebrates SFAI's legacy as an incubator for young artists and an integral part of San Francisco's creative ecosystem. The exhibition space is offered at a lower price point to increase accessibility to the fair.

The tenth edition of FOG Design+Art will be held January 18 - 21, 2024 at Fort Mason Center for Arts and Culture in San Francisco. The fair will open with a Preview Gala on Wednesday, January 17 benefitting the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art's (SFMOMA) education and exhibition programs. The 2024 edition of FOG Design+Art will present 45 booths (featuring 46 dealers) in Fort Mason Center's Pier 3, and nine exhibitors in FOG FOCUS, located next door in Pier 2. The fair's Honorary Chairs are Randi and Bob Fisher and Diana Nelson and John Atwater. In celebration of FOG Design+Art's tenth anniversary, the fair will also present the theme "A Love Letter to San Francisco," highlighting the cultural vibrancy and vitality of the area. The theme will emerge through various aspects of the fair, including the entryway installation, the addition of FOG FOCUS, ties to the FOG Talks, and the launch of SF Art Week as an official entity.

"We are so excited to present this year's edition of FOG, and to champion the artistic vitality of our city," said Douglas Durkin, FOG Design+Art steering committee member. "FOG was originally conceived of as a gift to the people of San Francisco, and being civic-minded has always been a priority for us. We look forward to more directly celebrating that connection with 'A Love Letter to San Francisco,' highlighting the many ways FOG contributes to and supports our vibrant ecosystem. FOG FOCUS is particularly exciting, presenting solo booths of artists who strongly deserve a platform, as well as bringing together a truly fantastic group of global galleries.

FOG FOCUS will feature nine exhibitors, as well as art installations, activations, and performances on-site, including an exhibition of contemporary art by Bay Area artists with disabilities co-presented by Creative Growth Art Center, Creativity Explored, and NIAD. FOG FOCUS expands the fair's purview, inviting galleries to present solo exhibitions by young and emerging artists and artists who have not received wide institutional recognition. San Francisco has long been a city rich with experimentation, cutting-edge art, and creative thinking, and FOG FOCUS aims to honor that legacy by championing artists who have not been long in the spotlight, and helping to create a platform for their work. The exhibitors included in the inaugural edition of FOG FOCUS are: Commonwealth and Council (Los Angeles), Crèvecœur (Paris), CULT Aimee Friberg (San Francisco), Et al. (San Francisco), George Adams Gallery (New York), Johansson Projects (Oakland), Jonathan Carver Moore (San Francisco), OCHI (Los Angeles), and Schlomer Haus Gallery (San Francisco). In addition, Creative Growth Art Center, Creativity Explored, and NIAD will co-present an exhibition of contemporary art by Bay Area artists with disabilities.

Among the 46 exhibitors in Pier 3 are eight dealers participating for the first time: **AGO Projects** (Mexico City), **Catharine Clark Gallery** (San Francisco), **David Lewis** (New York), **Galerie Max Hetzler** (Berlin), **Marianne Boesky Gallery** (New York), **Mendes Wood DM** (New York), **Nino Mier Gallery** (Los Angeles), and **Shulamit Nazarian** (Los Angeles).

In addition to the exhibitions on view, the fair will once again present **FOG Talks**—a programming series curated by steering committee member Susan Swig that explores ideas and issues relevant to the fields of art, design, technology, and our contemporary world—in the FOG Theater. The programs are all included with fair admission.

FOG Fair is overseen by a **steering committee** of San Franciscans with a deep commitment to the cultural fabric of the city: Douglas Durkin, Brittany Pattner, Sarah Wendell Sherrill, and Susan Swig. FOG FOCUS is overseen by the inaugural **host committee**: Azzurra Alliata di Montereale, Matt Farron, Lauren Ford, Emma Hanley, Pamela Hornik, Sophia Kinell, and Chris Perez. The fair was established in 2014 to create an international platform to champion art and design in the Bay Area.

Continuing FOG's long-standing support of SFMOMA, the Preview Gala supports the museum's exhibitions and education programs, while FOG Forum specifically raises funds for its Architecture and Design department.
