



12th EDITION OF FOG DESIGN + ART BRINGS TOGETHER WIDE RANGE OF LOCAL AND GLOBALLY RENOWNED GALLERIES

San Francisco, CA (Thursday, November 13, 2025) – Returning to Fort Mason Center for Arts and Culture in San Francisco from **January 21–25, 2026**, the 12th edition of the **FOG Design+Art** fair will bring together more than **60** leading galleries from around the world, including both new and returning participants, as well as the most expansive presentation of FOG FOCUS to date.

The 2026 fair will open with a **Preview Gala** on January 21, benefiting the **San Francisco Museum of Modern Art's** (SFMOMA) education initiatives. This year's honorary chairs are **Sir Jony Ive and Lady Heather Ive**, and **Tabitha Soren and Michael Lewis**—respected community leaders and long-standing supporters of FOG.

"Each year, FOG brings together an extraordinary group of galleries whose innovation and vision define the evolving landscape of design and contemporary art," said **Sydney Blumenkranz**, Director of FOG Design+Art. "The 2026 exhibitors embody the spirit of curiosity and collaboration that makes FOG such a vital part of the Bay Area's cultural community."

FOG is delighted to welcome 16 galleries participating for the first time, including: David Nolan Gallery, FRANKIE ROSSI, Gallery Wendi Norris, Goodman, Josh Lilley, OMR, Ortuzar, The Modern Institute, and Vielmetter in Pier 3, and Anat Ebgi, Blunk Space, Charlie James Gallery, Marta, Megan Mulrooney, Morgann Trumbull Projects, and re.riddle in FOG FOCUS. This year FOG welcomes more than 20 international galleries, including those with locations in Cape Town, Kyoto, Johannesburg, Mexico City, São Paulo, Paris, London, Monaco, Brussels, Glasgow. In addition, FOG is thrilled to include 15 galleries participating from the Bay Area.

Visitors to this year's fair will experience 16 galleries included in the largest presentation to date of **FOG FOCUS**, a platform dedicated to presentations of artists in the earlier stages of their career, and which offers works at a more accessible price point. In addition, FOG is pleased to announce the return of FOG MRKT, the dynamic entryway installation at Fort Mason's Festival Pavilion that debuted last year, once again spotlighting artists, designers, and makers. Six distinctive vendors will offer singular and editioned works that invite discovery and celebrate craftsmanship. This year, FOG MRKT will feature CCA, Wattis Institute for Contemporary Arts, Hugomento, MMclay, Quince & Co., Small Works Projects, and Works In Progress

The fair will also present **FOG Talks**, a series of dynamic conversations presented by Zoox that explore art, design, technology, and culture today. Curated by FOG Steering Committee member Susan Swig, these programs are included with fair admission.

FOG Design+Art is guided by a dedicated steering committee of San Franciscans deeply committed to the city's cultural vitality: **Douglas Durkin, Brittany Pattner, Sarah Wendell Sherrill, and Susan Swig**. FOG FOCUS is overseen by **Azzurra Alliata di Montereale, Matt Farron, Lauren Ford, Emma Hanley, Pamela Hornik, Sophia Kinell, and Chris Perez**.

Continuing FOG's long-standing support of SFMOMA, the **FOG FORUM** membership program brings together leading design professionals and raises funds for the museum's Architecture and Design department. Founded by FOG Steering Committee member **Douglas Durkin** and championed by SFMOMA Helen Hilton Raiser Curator and Head of Architecture and Design **Jennifer Dunlop Fletcher** and SFMOMA Curator of Art and Design **Joseph Becker**, FOG FORUM engages architects, industrial and interior designers, landscape architects, residential contractors, and other design professionals.
